# Mathematical Development

The children will have one or two formal maths inputs each week this term. These sessions will be teacher led and will help the children to understand the building blocks of early number. During the week, the children will be given many opportunities through unstructured and open ended play to explore what they have learnt during these guided sessions. We have a farm shop which will allow the children to use their understanding of number and money. If you can help them with counting objects (pennies, peas on a plate, cars etc) one at a time, this will enhance their understanding of counting and number.

### Possible Adult-led Activities

As well as the open ended learning, there will be opportunities for the children to learn about the following.

- Harvests around the world customs and traditions
- We will have a go at making corn dollies.
- We will be baking a harvest loaf and vegetable soup
- We will also be talking about taking care of ourselves and staying healthy.

In Early Years, we believe that children learn best when they choose where and how they would like to learn. As staff it is our role to observe and interact with the children, noticing the teaching opportunities and using them to progress the children's learning and develop their next steps. The majority of our resources are unstructured and open ended. This means that the children can use their own imaginations and ideas and that we are not dictating how or with what the children should be playing.

Our Role Play Areas are set up for the children in EYFS and KS1 initially as a farm shop in our outdoor area. Our indoor area is currently a nursery for our new 'babies'. These areas will be adapted and changed in line with the children's interests.
