Dear Parents.

This week in Class 1 the children have been learning the skills that they need to edit and improve on the work that they do. They have been learning how to estimate in maths using real objects to help them. In EYFS the children have continued to tend the garden (despite the bad weather) and discovered their first tomato. As part of our theme learning, the children have been looking at houses and homes in other countries – in particular The Gambia and Iceland. They are in the process of creating their own mud huts, out of mud and straw, and igloos, out of milk bottles. What a busy and interesting week!

This week in Class 2 the children have become 'eco-warriors'. Inspired by our new text 'Eddie the Penguin Saves the World', the children have been doing all sorts of research into penguins and why the ice caps are melting. They have also discovered that some other animals are also being affected by things such as deforestation and are at danger of extinction. Years 5 and 6 have created posters about endangered animals and how we can save them.

The children have also started learning about life cycles. They researched the life cycle of a penguin and found out all sorts of details such as incubation times and the sizes of eggs.

In maths, the children have been working really hard on their number sense units. Years 3 and 4 have been thinking about different units of time, including days in a month. Years 5 and 6 have been practising rounding both seven digit numbers and decimals.

In RE, Mrs Gray shared with the children about the special "Thy Kingdom Come" service she attended at Exeter Cathedral last weekend, to which she took some of the reflections all the children had made in worship, as part of our focus on prayer in the latter part of last half-term. In their RE learning, Class 2 have also been learning more about the story and celebration of Pentecost. They have explored the story through art and looked at symbols used to represent the Holy Spirit. In future weeks, the class will explore further the Christian belief in the Trinity and particularly what the Holy Spirit means to Christians.

Absence / Medical Notes

When your child is absent **please telephone school on the first day of the absence** so that we know not be concerned that they have not arrived in school. Get Knotting

Knot tying is an important skill for every crew member on board a sailing ship. For the various parts of the sails and rigging different knots are used and the crew have to **trust** that the knots are tied properly and will hold.

We all use knots occasionally to hold something securely in place. See if you can master these knots:

A Clove Hitch knot, to secure a rope to a post.



A Reef knot to join 2 ropes together.
