Possible Activities

Using No Nonsense Number Facts to support mental maths and fluency skills.
Exploring a range of resources and equipment to support learning.
Representing numbers in a range of different ways.
Write a cheque using both numbers and words knowing the value of each digit.
Comparing numbers in a range of contexts such as game scores.
Using 'Can You Convince Me' reasoning questions to deepen understanding.
Solve 'Real World' maths problems

Possible Activities

Using the opening of the story 'Fair's Fair' to write the ending of an adventure story and recording it as a Cbeebies bedtime story.
Comparing a range of Victorian diaries and writing an entry as Queen Victoria.
Reading the poem 'Twas the Night Before Christmas' and using our own Christmas traditions to write modern versions.
Bug Club reading, comprehension and Grammar and Spelling activities.
Play spelling games.
Use 'word of the day'

Discuss Explore kNOWLEDGE activities

Handwriting practise on slates, exploring museum artefacts, setting a Victorian table, decorating a Christmas tree, exploring the different between modern and Victorian homes, weaving with wool.

Possible Activities

Exploring Queen Victoria's family tree and her succession to the throne.
Investigating significant events during the Victorian period.
Using maps to find countries in the British Empire.
Using the National Archives and National Portrait Gallery to find primary sources of information.
Researching the lives of Florence Nightingale and Mrs Beeton.
Cooking Victorian recipes.
Making Victorian Christmas decorations.

3/4: Investigate changes of state: melting, freezing, boiling, evaporation, condensation. Use thermometers to measure temperature.

5/6 Compare the viscosity of liquids.
Investigate thermal conductivity. Explore uses and features of different sorts of metal, compare different plastics.
Set up fair tests to investigate processes such as rusting and compare similar products.

Mathematical Development

Possible Activities

Exploring a range of Queen Victoria's portraits.

Learning a range of notes on a recorder and playing simple Christmas carols.

Possible Activities

Retell stories from Islam and Christianity.
Role play how people might have responded to Muhammad's message.
Use pictures, virtual tours and video to investigate a mosque.
Make a model of a mosque.
Interview a Christian leader and investigate their roles and responsibilities.

Consider the importance of rules, including the "rule of law". Write class rules.
Evaluate learning behaviours and consider how to develop learning skills.
Identify own and others' strengths and take on different roles within teams.
Identify dangers online or in the home and suggest how to respond to them.
Suggest ways of resolving difficulties in relationships.
