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

## Dear Parents,

The stimulus for our writing this half term for 'Ready, Steady, Write' was the nursery rhyme 'Georgie, Porgy Pudding and Pie'. In Reception, the children listened to different Nursery Rhymes and then painted their favourite! They had a go at writing the name of it underneath. In Year 1, the children used their knowledge of syllables, nouns, adjectives and verbs to change the nursery rhyme into their own nonsense rhyme. They really enjoyed performing these for you all at sharing assembly. In Maths this half term, Year 1 have been learning to add and subtract numbers to 10 including number pairs to 10. This is something that you could practice at home.







In Reception, the children have been working on their fine motor skills. They have a daily session called 'Hi-Five' which is designed to practise skills such as cutting, pincer grip skills and develops the skills of using cutlery. Well done boys - you have worked really hard this term.









On 29<sup>th</sup> November, Branscombe, Farway, Broadhembury and Woodbury Salterton's Class 1 children took part in a P.E. sporting event at Branscombe Village Hall. At the event, the children played lots of fun team games, where they had to use their skills of communication and teamwork, working with children they didn't know very well. The children all had a really fun day, there was lots of laughter and high fiving and they were all very tired by the time they arrived back at school!





In addition to continuing their World War 2 topic this month, Class 2 began a new maths unit on multiplication and division; to help their studies they also had daily timetables practice. In Science, they studied magnetism and enjoyed two trips to Honiton Community College, where they conducted experiments in which the children made paperclips levitate, sank paper boats and flew paper helicopters. In English, after concluding their study of persuasive writing Class 2 began a unit on narrative poetry. The children were quite rightly extremely proud of the poems they created and loved sharing their poems in our weekly assemblies. It's wonderful to have so many pieces of beautiful work displayed around the classroom. Class 2 was also regularly filled with the sound of sweet music from the children's tongue drum percussion studies.

# **Sharing Assembly**

## **Morning Routine**

Following the changes that had to be put in place due to Covid, I wanted to remind parents of the routine and timings for the mornings now that we are back in 'normal times'. Children who **haven't** attended breakfast club are able to come in to school from 8.40am when the gate will be opened. Class 2 children can come straight in through the main door and into class so they can get organised and settled ready for the day's learning. Class 1 parents can bring the children into the playground, where the Class 1 teacher will meet them and bring them up the steps of the Class 1 back door. The gate will be locked again at 9am. Children coming in after this time will receive a late mark in the register. The bus children will be met and brought in to school as usual.
