It has been lovely to see the children back and looking well again. Class 1 have started the term off at a fair pace with some brilliant writing. Our first book this term is 'A Tiny Seed' by Eric Carle whom the children know from 'The Hungry Caterpillar'.

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The children started by writing a journey tale of a frog, from frogspawn to adult frog. Some wrote in story-style and some in a more factual way, but the pace and stamina they showed was great- well done! In maths, we have begun looking at multiplication and division – please encourage the children to play the Times Table Rock Stars games.

Reception have been able to get outside and have been sporting their new overalls – hopefully this will keep them warm and dry on bad weather days! I will be sending home some challenges for your child to complete, so that they can progress with the 'Good Samaritan Award'. Thank you to those who have completed some of the challenges.

Don't forget our trip next week – hopefully the weather will stay like this. Please make sure that the SOE3 forms come back into school by Monday.


This week, Class Two have been learning about dark and light. Over the week, they have taken part in a range of different experiments that helped them understand some of the trickier concepts. Year 3 and 4 tested how reflective different materials are, when designing a new school book bag, as well as looking at the terms transparent, translucent and opaque, when designing curtains.

Years 5 and 6 learnt about how light travels differently through different materials, and this can cause refraction which makes an optical illusion. They also used prisms to create visible light spectrums and learnt about Isaac Newton who discovered this.









In PSHE, we have been learning about British Values and discussed the terms equality, diversity and cohesion. These words were quite tricky to unpick, so we watched some 1 Decision videos to help us write definitions. The children have also been working on their Good Samaritan Awards, everyone in Class Two has now earned their Red Certificate and a few have even reached White!

After a lot of hard work, the clay tiles we made in Arts' Week, showing Christian Symbols, are now on display. Make sure you pop into the library to see them in our worship area. Everyone is very proud of the hard word and time that went into making them.

Free School Meals

As part of the new universal credit system, that is being rolled out across the country, the criteria for claiming free school meals is changing. This may mean that previously ineligible children, now qualify for free school meals. In addition any child who qualifies for free school meals will then be eligible until 2022, regardless of circumstance, and without the need for reassessment. We are therefore encouraging all parents to go online at https://new.devon.gov.uk/educationandfamilies/school-information/school-meals and check their eligibility. As well as you as a family gaining free meals, school gets extra money into its budget for every child who is entitled to free school meals. So please check your eligibility and apply if able.
