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Dear Parents,

This week in Class 1 the children have been writing their invented story called 'The Day My Teacher got Kidnapped by Aliens'. They have been using their knowledge of fictional recounts to help them. EYFS have been busy with their learning in the outdoor area and are getting really good at using the resources respectfully – well done Reception.

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In Science the children have been observing plants scientifically and have produced some fantastic results. Their observation skills have improved vastly over the week, and they have been able to compare their plant with their classmates' – noting similarities and differences.

This week Class Two have been designing and making their kites. They created a set of criteria that each kite had to meet, and used planning sheets to support them with designing. The children had to work though lots of problems such as how to strengthen their frame, and which material would be strong, but also light. After two afternoons of hard work the kites were finally finished! The children took them outside to test, and had a lovely time trying to get their kite to fly. Nearly all of the kites were a success, and they are now on display in class.







On Wednesday afternoon, the whole school came together to work on an exciting art project. We held a competition to find new bridge paintings, for our Broadhembury Bridges display. The school split up into their bridge teams and, using photos for inspiration, set about creating their own water colour pictures. The children showed great team work skills, and supported each other to create some brilliant final

# **Secondary School Reminder**

All year 6 parents need to apply for a secondary school place for their child by 31st October 2017. Applications can be made using the online system at <a href="https://www.devon.gov.uk/admissionsonline">www.devon.gov.uk/admissionsonline</a> or by contacting My Devon, the customer service centre, on 0345 155 1019 to request an application form. The application form should be returned to the Admissions Team before the **31st October 2017**.

### **First Day Contact**

Please could all parents be aware that they should let school know by 9am if their child is going to be absent or late for any reason, both on the first day, and on any subsequent days. Please do this by phoning rather than emailing, you can leave a message if nobody is able to answer.

If a child does not arrive at school and no message is received, we have a duty to establish a reason for their absence. This week we have received a letter from Devon County Council asking all schools to remind parents to make contact with the school on the morning of any absence and that the school will use the child's emergency contact list in the event of no answer on the parent(s) home, mobile or work phone(s). As a result of a recent incident in another county, DCC advise parents to ensure that an emergency contact has the ability to gain access to their house to check all is well in the event that the parent cannot be contacted and this becomes a safeguarding concern.

If school processes fail to locate a pupil then the school will 'Risk Assess' the situation and;

- Telephone the Police using 999 if the child is considered to be at risk of immediate and significant harm or danger
- Telephone the Police on 101 if not at risk of immediate significant harm but where there are escalated welfare concerns
- Continue to try and contact parent(s) and/or emergency contacts if the pupil is not considered to be at any increased risk.

On their child's return to school following an absence, parents must provide a note explaining the reason for their absence. If this is not received, we will send home an absence form for you to complete and return to school. Please note that if a written absence note is not received, absences may be recorded as unauthorised, even if you have called us to provide a reason.

#### **Collective Worship Activity**

If the children bring back something that you have done at home linked to the Collective Worship activity, or can talk about a discussion they've had at home linked to it, then Mrs Gray will award them with a new special sticker.
