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Dear Parents,

What a busy week! The children have been finding out about their favourite dinosaur, ready to write a fact file, for their pop-up book. They have also been finding out about the Mesozoic Era, and what the world would have looked like, at each of the three points throughout this era. In theme, KS1 have split into 3 teams, and have each taken either the Triassic, Jurassic or Cretaceous period, to model out of Paper Mache, using the geographic information that they have found out to help them.

Reception have been busy working on numbers to 20, and have made the role play area into a 'Number House'. They have been busy practising counting and forming their numbers. We have also created a 'Number Table' and will be focussing on one number each week, starting with 1.

This week Class Two have been very busy! On Monday, the children were lucky enough to attend a gymnastics festival, with the children from Farway, and Honiton Primary. They took part in a range of activities, from balancing to using trampolines. The children really enjoyed the event, and had the opportunity to use some specialist equipment, and try out the newly built gym.



In theme learning, the children have been naming and ordering the planets in the solar system, and asking some great questions such as 'why is Pluto no longer a planet?', and 'where is the edge of space?' They then learnt about some of the different scientists responsible for discovering planets, and explaining how they move. The children acted out some of the different discoveries, before writing a

Our space theme has also carried over into Literacy and Maths this week, with the children writing introduction paragraphs about Stars and the Moon, while the circles debugged some rocket instructions that had gone wrong, during their work on turns and direction.

On Friday morning, the children also had the opportunity to visit HCC again, but this time for another science lesson. This session focused on light, and the children had lots of fun experimenting with different sources of light, and prisms. They worked very hard on all of the experiments, and this learning has helped us answer some of our questions about how light from the Sun reaches Earth.
