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Dear Parents,

This week has been a busy one in Class 1. The children are beginning to learn the routines and expectations in Class 1. Please support them with this by talking to them about their day and sharing their reading books with them.

This week, Class1 had Firefighter Dan come into school to teach them about Fire Safety. He talked to us about the role of a firefighter and some of the children wanted to dress up in a firefighter's uniform. The children learnt about the importance of smoke alarms, when to dial 999 and the importance of not touching matches. Firefighter Dan asked the children to check that their homes have working smoke alarms and gave us a number to call if we wanted smoke alarms fitted. Finally, the children practised 'Stop, Drop and Roll'. Ask them about it.



Key Stage 1 will be bringing home homework this week. Please take time to go through the sheet with your children. If you have any questions at all, please feel free to email me via the admin@broadhembury.devon.sch.uk address or I am happy to chat with you after school. Morning times are particularly busy in Class 1.

We are trying to teach the children to be independent in coming in and getting ready for learning. Please could you ensure that you drop off and pick up from the bottom of the steps at the door at the far end of the playground. Please make sure that you are in the playground to collect your children at 3.30pm as the children become quite anxious after a long day if there is no one there to collect them when everyone else is leaving. If you are late, the children will go to after-school club which means that there will be a charge. Thank you for your support with this.

This week Class 2 were lucky enough to go on their first school trip of the autumn term. Along with the children from Branscombe and Farway they visited Upottery Airfield Heritage Centre and went back in time to experience life in WWII, particularly the pilots and paratroopers of the RAF. Inside the Sergeant's bedroom the children thought about how the paratroopers would have felt knowing that at any minute they could be called up to fly to an unknown destination, jump out of a plane and fight for their country. The children decided they would want to write letters home to their families to keep in touch and reassure

them that they were safe for now. The children also tried on soldier's outfits and thought about evacuation and food rationing in 1940s Britain.







After lunch, the children returned to school and took part in some orienteering activities - they thought about paratroopers who may have landed with their parachute in an unknown place and what skills they would have needed to navigate their way to safety. The children found the eight points of a compass and used this to play a code-breaking game to solve an anagram - SPITFIRE! The children had a great time and represented Broadhembury School wonderfully.

The activities from this trip are really going to help the children with their diary writing in literacy, as next week they will be writing diary entries in role as a WWII pilot. They hope to use these experiences to inform our writing to make it as realistic as possible!

International Cross of Nails School

We are very excited to share with you the news that we have been accepted as an International Cross of Nails School – linking with Coventry Cathedral. During the Second World War Coventry Cathedral was bombed. In the ruins the following morning two charred beams were found laying in the shape of a cross. Later, this was displayed in the preserved ruins with the words 'Father Forgive' inscribed in the surviving stonework behind it. A local priest also made another cross from three of the many fifteenth century nails that littered the scene. It was quickly decided to preserve the ruins and build a modern cathedral next to them. I visited this over the summer and it is a very inspiring place. In the earliest days after the bombing the Cross of Nails, which is now displayed on the new altar, became a symbol of peace and hope. The Cross of Nails Community includes schools, communities, parishes and other organisations who have shown a commitment to the values of peace, hope and reconciliation.

We shared some of the work we have been doing in worship and throughout our school and federation with the cathedral team and we will be presented with our own Cross of Nails in a very special service in a couple of weeks.

The service will take place on Monday 24th September at 9.30am. It would be lovely if lots of parents and members of the community could join us for the service. We would like to have refreshments back in school afterwards so we would be very grateful for contributions of cakes and biscuits on the morning.

The children will be able to tell you more about The Cross of Nails Community, and there is a lovely display in the entrance hall – please have a look.

Class 2 World War Poster

Class 2 are going to be involved in designing a poster to celebrate 100 years since the end of WW1, we will be in competition with Payhembury School and the winning design will go into the parish magazine! Child Assault Prevention Training


