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

Dear Parents,

The children in Class 1 have continued with their work on Flower Fairies this week and the children's poems were so lovely that they have typed them up using Word (well done KS1) and have illustrated them.





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This has led on to the children learning about some of the artists who inspired Cicely Mary Barker and they have compared some of the works from these artists and discussed what they liked and disliked about the artists.

The children are now innovating on the poem that they have learnt and we are excited to be able to share these with you next week.

Reception have also been enjoying The Flower Fairies and have been making fairy gardens when working independently. They have chosen their own flower or plant and drawn and coloured it. Then they have written a sentence about their fairy. Well done Reception.

Thank you for your co-operation in the mornings with allowing your children to come into the classroom independently. We are really pleased at how well the children are putting their things away and getting ready for their learning each morning.

Last Friday, Class Two travelled to Exeter, to take part in a practice walk for the Exe Valley Challenge. Even though the weather was hot, the children did a great job of walking just over 3 miles, along the main route in a fairly quick time. All of the children were sensible and very respectful to members of the public and a credit to their schools. I hope they all enjoy taking part in the event on Sunday, and look forward to hearing the results.

This week Class Two have been focusing on developing their skills as biographers, in preparation for their final piece. They have researched J K Rowling and worked as a class and in pairs, to write a short biography about her. A big thank you to those of you who have helped with research for our literacy project, the children now have a wealth of facts to support their writing.

Life Skills

Year 6 joined other schools in the local area at a 'Life Skills' event at the Donkey Sanctuary. In total the children took part in seven sessions, all focusing on how to keep themselves and others safe. The sessions included watching a video on Internet safety and protecting personal data, a quiz about being a responsible dog owner, discussing and drawing what happens when we are scared and how to cope with this, water safety including using ropes to rescue someone and preventing dangers around water, a fire safety quiz with the fire brigade and beach safety with the RNLI. The Fire Officer commented that the children in the Federation gave the most correct responses out of all the schools on the day. The children all joined in with the discussions and had a good knowledge of keep themselves and others safe. The afternoon ended with a bang when the fire brigade demonstrated what happens when you put a small amount of water on a hot chip pan.
