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Dear Parents

After an exceptionally wet start to the week it was all systems go for Class Two as they joined other schools in the learning community for an athletics tournament. Class two teamed up with the children from Farway and competed in mixed teams. There were 4 teams: Jubilee 1 boys, Jubilee 1 girls, Jubilee 2 boys and Jubilee 2 girls. The children were brilliant sports, trying their best in each event. Abby and Jayden put in extra effort, competing in every event as we were short of one child in each Jubilee 1 team. Jubilee boys 1 stole the show winning two of their relay events. The final results are still to be released but we will keep you updated on their progress. The children all came back to school full of enthusiasm after having such a fun and active afternoon. They have also been stretching their brains with a trip to HCC for a science lesson. The children enjoyed a 'forces and magnets' themed lesson led by the HCC science teachers. They used Newton meters to find out the amount of force required to do different things and learnt how to create magnets from iron nails. Today Class Two joined up with our federated schools and spent the day at an Anglo Saxon village at Escot Park as part of their History topic – Invaders and Settlers. The children really enjoyed the experience and fully immersed themselves in Anglo Saxon living. Through out the day the children delved into the past and enjoyed activities focused around the time of the Anglo-Saxons including wattle and daubing, lighting fires, making pennies, bread making, spoon making, forging, milling, pole lathing, splitting logs and dressing up.

This week in Class one the children have been working on looking at how 2 digit numbers are made up. They will be continuing this into next week. The children have also been learning a new text called 'Unfortunately' and Mrs Symonds have sent home the story map and text for the children to practise. Next week the children will be writing a story from a wordless picture book in the style of 'Unfortunately'. On Monday next week Class 1 will be carrying out their service for the community or 'Umuganda'. The children have been learning about 'Umuganda' in RE. The plan had been to help clear the churchyard; however the bad weather has meant that the churchyard is too soggy to tend at the moment. Instead the children will be polishing the inside of the church including the pews. If you feel that you could spare an hour on Monday 28th November at 2pm to help the children with this, please could you let Mrs Symonds know.

Rehearsals are now well underway for the Christmas play and all the children have been singing their hearts out learning the songs for the performance. With just over two weeks to go, it is really important for children to start learning their lines! Scripts were sent home in the week. A letter will also be coming home soon with regards to the Christmas performance.

Last week's Children in Need event, organised entirely by the children, has so far raised a huge £160 and there is still sponsorship money to come in. If your child took part in the sponsored silence please can they bring the money in ASAP so it can be sent off to Children in Need.
