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Dear Parents

We are very pleased to welcome to school today the new Diocesan Director of Education, Mr John Searson. He has enjoyed having a look around the school and meeting some of the pupils.

I had a super afternoon in Class 2 yesterday. Myself and Miss Prince are sharing the teaching of RE this year. We are very lucky to be able to be using some super new resources that the Diocese of Exeter are promoting. They are called Understanding Christianity and I completed my training for using them this week. They will be used with all age groups across the federation. The basis of the scheme is a big poster of the biblical timeline. It's called 'The Big Frieze' and some children asked to bring a copy of it home to show you. It's a very detailed piece of art work, which many of the adults on the training found tricky, however, the children yesterday seemed really inspired by it and noticed lots of elements that I hadn't spotted yet. I was really impressed. It would be great to hear any feedback from discussions at home if the children talk about it with you.

Also this week in class two the children have started their theme of Invaders and Settlers with the Romans. They have been looking at maps to find Rome as well as discovering the different countries the Romans conquered. As part of art, they have started designing mosaics using Roman designs as inspiration which has provoked all sorts of questions about the Romans that the children would like to find out! In maths, the children have continued to look at place value with numbers ranging from millions to decimals. They initially found estimating where the numbers needed to go on a number line a bit tricky but the year 3 and 4's created a number washing line to help us. In Literacy the children have been sentence spotters this week and have hunted for different types of sentences in our Romans text.

Mrs Redding is planning to take the Class 2 children to Honiton Community College to do a science session, relating to their topic on forces, on the 23rd November. So that we can work out the best way to transport the children there, please could you let Sarah know as soon as possible if you are able to help with transport and how many seats you have in your car. The children will need to be there at 10 and will finish at 11 and parent helpers need to complete a declaration regarding MOT and insurance.

In Class 1 this week the children have been working hard learning our text 'What do you do with a tail like this?' They have been using actions to help them. They have also been busy developing new routines and discussing the expectations of Class 1 during their circle times.

Please could all children in Class 1 have a full named PE kit in school. Our main PE lesson is on a Thursday. Homework will come home on a Friday. Please could you initial the homework to show that you and your child have spent time together discussing the question of the week. If Year 1 and 2 children can add some written thoughts and illustrations Mrs Symonds will discuss them during the week.

We have had a lot of positive feedback about our Bible knitting project. Some examples are on display in the entrance hall. Please do encourage friends and family to donate wool or give them a pattern! Spare patterns are available from the school office.

Just a reminder that sharing assembly takes place every Friday from 3pm until the end of the school day. This is an opportunity for parents to join us and have a look at some of the children's learning that they have been enjoying each week.

Changeable Weather

As we are now into autumn, our wonderful English weather is very changeable. Therefore please ensure your child is sent to school with a jumper and a coat should the weather suddenly turn.

Good Samaritan Awards

We launched a new PSHE scheme of work last week and in connection with this we have planned a new award system for the children. It is called The Good Samaritan Awards. This award system supports the PSHE, Citizenship and British Values elements of our curriculum and we hope staff and parents will encourage pupils to work towards the awards. Children will be asked to complete tasks relating to the following areas; Staying Safe, Keeping Healthy, Enjoying and Achieving, Economic Wellbeing and Making a Positive Contribution. The aim being to give children a broad and balanced view of society.

At the start of term each teacher will plan a Life Skills activity ensuring that all children are involved. To achieve their Red award the children will need to complete 5 challenges, including the class ones. White they will need to achieve 10 and for the Blue award they will need to complete 15 challenges. This will be over the course of the year.

If the children raise money for a charity by putting in extra effort they can win a Citizenship Award Certificate for thinking of others, having an idea, putting in the hard work and raising money for a nominated charity.

On last weeks newsletter we attached the sheet of challenges – we hope your children enjoy achieving them both at home and at school. Please keep us informed of what the children have been working towards.

We would be very grateful to hear from any parents or other adult family members who could commit to coming into school for an hour a week to listen to our children read. This can be a very rewarding role, and our children would benefit greatly. Please get in touch if you are able to help.
