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Dear Parents,

I would like to thank everyone for their kind donations of plants, bulbs and compost this week which meant that our memorial day on Monday was so special. The whole school came together to spend the morning gardening. A memorial planter for Mrs Facey had been delivered on Friday, and the children worked hard to fill it with compost, and plant some of the many plants donated in her memory. While the planter was being filled, the children took the opportunity to tidy other flower beds around the school, and brighten them up with some new plants. A small group of children also filled some pots with lavender, for the spirituality garden.

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In the afternoon we welcomed Mrs Facey's family and the new vicar, Rev. John Hayhoe, to the school. Mrs Facey's family planted the last few plants and the vicar blessed the planter. Thank you for all your help in creating this lasting memorial to Mrs Facey.





This week in Class 1, we have begun our very exciting topic of Dinosaurs. The children have been learning an extract from the book we have chosen, called "Dino Dinners" by Mick Manning and Brita Granstrom. The children are learning how to write using different voices – the author's voice, and the voice of one of the characters in the book.

In maths this week, Year 1 have been learning counting, and have been ordering numbers forwards and backwards, to and from 50. It would be great if you could practise this with your children, at any opportunity, and in any real-life situations. Year 2 meanwhile, have been learning the symbol that we use to represent greater than and less than. They have been practising using it to compare the value of numbers.

We have also begun looking at timelines. Our class timeline has helped us to show the passing of time, and this is helpful when we are looking back such a long way. Any discussion that you can have at home about this will help the children's understanding immensely.

In Class 2, this week has seen the start of our very eagerly anticipated Space topic. The children began by recording everything they knew about space, before learning about the Flat Earth Theory. They read lots of different scientific ideas from a range of sources, and decided which ideas supported which theory. The children then decided on their own opinion as to whether the earth is flat or round, using evidence to support their thinking. We have started to talk to the children about depth of learning in the context of diving in the sea. There are some lovely displays in the school illustrating this. This science activity was a great chance for them to deepen their learning, and begin their journey from paddling to snorkelling.

In Literacy, they have also been following the space theme, and are going to be writing their own non-fiction books about space. The text we are using to help structure our ideas is called 'Penguins'.

In maths, the children have been working hard and investigating shape. They have all been able to name the features of a wide range of shapes, and have thought about which shapes we might see in a rocket. The children created 3D shapes from nets, which looked like aliens from another planet, and wrote down a way we could spot the alien from its properties.
