Dear Parents,

This week in Class 1, the children have been busy. In Literacy, they have been working hard making some lovely Christmas Cards. They have been choosing nursery rhymes and fairy tales, and have painted them onto their cards, in the same style as the Jolly Christmas Postman.

In Maths, the children have been learning some new Maths games. The children have particularly enjoyed the one called 'mind the gap' - ask them about it!

In RE, the children have been talking about Advent, and have thought about what they could do for someone else, as well as enjoying their own Advent Calendars. They have also written their first Advent promise. They will write two more over the next couple of weeks, one thinking about what they could do to help family and friends, and one thinking about what they could change within themselves.

This week, Class Two have started work on their final speeches in literacy. They thought carefully about who might be an enemy of a Victorian child, and drew a picture of their evil villain! The artwork was brilliant and some of the pictures were very scary indeed! The children also looked at what the other speeches we have studied, talked about, to help them make an informed choice about how they might convince others to help them. Once the speeches are complete, they will be performing them using a green screen, to help immerse them in the Victorian era.

On Tuesday afternoon, the whole school came together to work on a new Design & Technology project, celebrating Fruits of the Spirit, which has been our focus in worship. Each child designed a pendant for our bunting, with a different fruit on. They tried to link their fruit, to an aspect of the Fruits of the Spirit, which was quite tricky. The children then drew their designs onto the pendants, using a mixture of fabric pens and paint. The final results look amazing, and have been sent off for sewing, ready to display in the library.

Papercrafting Workshop. Drop in anytime between 11am and 3pm.


