Dear Parents,

The butterflies have hatched! Class 1 has been all aflutter with excitement this week as our chrysalises had emerged into beautiful butterflies over the weekend. It has been a wonderful experience for the children who now want to do the same with ladybirds so watch this space.

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The children have continued to work on their fables this week, and will now begin to formulate their own fables thinking about what moral their fable could have, and the characters within it. We look forward to sharing these with you at sharing assembly next week. In maths the children have been working on problem solving skills and are beginning to realise that the process is as important, if not more so, than the answer. Our learning behaviours have been helping us recognise what we do well in our learning and I have been handing out lots and lots of learning behaviour stickers this week. Keep up the good work Class 1.

This week in Class Two we have been adapting to not having year 6 around as they were at their transition week at Honiton Community College. The children have had a chance to see what our class will be like in September, with the year 2's joining us for a few afternoons. It has been a very quiet week, and it has given the children a chance to settle back into routine.

In Literacy, the children have been writing their final play scripts about an endangered animal, and will create animations using their scripts at the end of the week. The children have really enjoyed the project, and it has been really closely linked to their theme learning, where they have been finding out about the causes of global warming. Our Eco-warriors have designed posters to put up around the school, reminding people to recycle.

In maths, we have been using Singapore maths strategies, to help us learn the theory behind formal column addition and subtraction. The children have become experts creating help videos to teach others how the methods work. The children have really enjoyed the practical use of equipment in supporting their learning.

A few weeks ago we were due to attend the Honiton Learning Community Quad Kids Year 3/4 event. This event was unfortunately cancelled, however the staff from HCC have used the scores from the Community Games event to create a league table from the cross over events and I am very proud to say that the Jubilee Federation came second out of five teams! The overall scores were as follows: Upottery - 668 points, Jubilee Federation - 549 points, Offwell - 534 points, Honiton Primary School - 499 points, Stockland Primary - 472 points. A huge well done to the year 3 and 4 children!

Class two children did superbly at the Honiton Community Games with several pupils winning some medals:
